M O B I L I Z A T I O N

- Over 600 participants received health screenings and 120 volunteers served at our annual 9Health Fair.
- 2,550 Operation Christmas Child boxes were sent to Samaritan's Purse. Over 30 people from Waterstone volunteered to help collect and process the boxes.
- The Food Pantry served 55-70 families each week, equaling around 300 people served weekly and 3,000 lbs. of food given each month.
- 75 Compassion Kids were sponsored at our Compassion Sunday event bringing the total number of Compassion Kids that have been sponsored through Waterstone to over 500.
- 40 children in foster care were taken to camp for a week of fun, compassion and encouragement with Royal Family Kids Camp. Also 17 kids participated in Royal Family Kids Club once a month.



MISSIONS

 1 new Global Partner was supported and sent on the field to Mozambique bringing Waterstone's total Global Partners to 24 people supported around the world.

WHY DO WE HAVE ELDERS?

As a church, we look to the Scriptures as our authority and guide in all matters of faith and practice, including leadership of the church. The New Testament gives clear instructions for elders to lead and shepherd Christ's church. (1 Peter 5:1-4)

WHAT IS AN ELDER & WHAT DO THEY DO?

"Elder" and "pastor" are not two different offices in the New Testament, but two titles for the same office. According to the New Testament, elders are responsible for the primary oversight of the church. Elders serve the body pastorally - feeding, caring and shepherding God's flock (1 Peter 5:1-4). They are to lead the church by setting mission and providing accountability for the lead pastor (1 Timothy 5:17, Titus 1:7). They oversee the preaching and teaching of the Scriptures (1 Timothy 4:13, Titus 1:9), visit and pray for the sick (James 5:14), arbitrate doctrinal or relational disagreements within the church when the individual parties cannot reach reconciliation (Acts 15:6, Matthew 18:15-20), and administer church discipline for the purpose of and in the spirit of Galatians 6:1-2. The elders also provide budget direction toward mission as well as financial accountability for the church.

WHAT IS THE PROCESS BY WHICH ELDERS ARE CHOSEN?

The current elders are responsible to nominate new elders that will be affirmed by the membership. Those nominated must fit the requirements listed by the apostle Paul in 1 Timothy 3:1-13 and Titus 1:6-9. Each prospective elder has an initial interview with a subset of elders, followed by an in-depth interview with the entire elder board. Afterwards, the nominees will be submitted to the membership for a vote of affirmation at the annual meeting. Each year the entire group of non-staff elders must be affirmed by the membership at the annual meeting. An appointed elder can serve up to 4 consecutive 2-year terms.
